

It does not take long after ones technique is learned, and an operator is more than compensated by the relaxed abdominal walls, the slight post-operative pain and the complete absence of shock to the patient. After the operation I have eight ounces of normal saline given per rectum, every two hours, to be retained. I instruct the nurses that the patient must not be permitted to suffer. I formerly gave one-sixth grain of morphine as soon as consciousness returned, but recently I have found this unnecessary unless there is restlessness, then I give twenty grains of chloral with two grains of codeine per rectum. This usually is sufficient and in most cases is not needed until eighteen hours after the operation. In many cases I use nothing. I allow the patient to have water even if they vomit, as I believe it washes out the stomach and the vomiting will not be prolonged. At this point I feel that a word about the general anesthetic will be appropriate. Nitrous oxid-oxygen is an excellent anesthetic because of the prompt return to consciousness which often occurs before the patient leaves the operating room, especially so when no ether has been used. I have found where the local nerve blocking has been practiced it has been unnecessary to use ether. I believe the only time it has been used in my cases was to secure relaxation in making...
